He went on to win the series by 15 points. It was his fourth Midwinter championship. Second, third and fourth places were separated by only 1% points with Marc Eagan and Jeff Lenhart taking third and fourth respectively. Dave Chapin fin ished fifth with a DSQ in the fourth race after being in second place up to that point.

Jerry Thompson took delivery of a new boat and started out with a 32nd in the first race but progressively got the boat going to finish eighth overall.

Tuesday night an awards banquet was held at the club. Winners were presented crystal trophies which were coordinated with etched glasses given as favors.

Reynolds, Chapin Split Bacardi and Gamblin Races

The Royal Nassau Sailing Club hosted the armual Bacardi Cup and SCIRA Winter Championship on March 20-23 in Montagu Bay, Nassau, Bahamas.

Of the 28 participants, 16 were from the USA, 1 from Denmark, and 11 from Nassau. The visiting Snipes were transported across the Gulf from Miami on the M.V. "Betry K." and their crews put up in the homes of club members.

Edgar Mulhall, vice commodore of the host club, was Race Committee Chairman. The Committee are to be congratulated on the fact that the starting lines were so good that there were no general recalls, Except for two races the conditions suited the heavy weather sailors as the wind blew 18 knots and more. For the first two races life preservers were obligatory.

Californian Mark Reyrolds and crew Mike O'Brien won the Bacardi Cup by one position over Fred Abels of Locust Valley and crew Dan Coughlin who took second place. Third was Californian Juck Franco and crew Scott Lindley. Bahamian Myles Pritchard and his crew Jason McCarroll were fourth. Fifth was the only Danish entry Jan Persson and his son Jonathan.

Opening day for the three-race Bacardi Cup saw easterly winds of 18-20 knots. There were two races with Abels placing second and first. Franco posted a first and a fifth and Reynolds a fourth and a second. The next morning the winds were too strong and racing was postponed till the afternoon when the final race of the Bacardi Cup was sailed over two triangles finishing to windward in winds in excess of 20 knots. This race was wen by Reynolds with Abels fifth and Franco ninth.

The five-race Gamblin Memorial series started immediately after the final race of the Bacardi Cup. Conditions were such that there was a shortened course with the finish downwind. This race was won by Reynolds with Perssor, second. The next day two races were sailed, the first in easterly breezes up to 18 knots and the second in light winds from the southwest. These two races were won by Reynolds and Chapin.

On Saturday, the last racing day, two back-to-back races were sailed in northwesterly winds at about 18 knots drop ping to 12 knots for the final race. These races were wen by Abels and Chapin.

Chapin and his crew Robert Lindley dominated the Gamblin series winning handily with 8.5 points with 2 firsts, 2 seconds and a third. Franco took second place with a second, 3 fourths and a tenth. Reynolds was third, with 2 firsts, a sixth, a seventh and a disappointing twelfth following a jib halyard problem.

The traditional Bacardi Daiquiri Party was held at the club on Wednesday evening following the first two Bacardi Cup races and was much enjoyed by everyone.

The Charles Kelly Memorial Trophy

was won by Dave Chapin, the skipper with the best score (after dropping his worst race) for the races in the two Nassau regattas. The Carl Zimmerman Trophy was won by Mark Reynolds, the overall winner of the Southern Winter Racing Circuit. Myles Pritchard and Jason McCarroll won the Concorde Trophy awarded to the best Bahamian entry in the two series.

The trophy presentation took place at the club on Saturday night where there was dinner, lively dancing and reminiscing. For mary, Sunday was spent swimming and relaxing on the heach at Rose Island. — Godfrey K. Kelly
