NOTICE OF RACE

ORGANIZING AUTHORITY:

The Organizing Authority is the Buffalo Canoe Club, in cooperation with the Snipe Class International Racing Association-USA (SCIRA USA).

RULES:

- The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing ("RRS"), the current SCIRA Class Rules, By-Laws, the Rules of Conduct for Conducting National and International Regattas (ROC), and the trophy restrictions of the Deeds of Gift.
- Any Conflict arising between the Deeds of Gift and the SCIRA Rules of Conduct shall be resolved by the application of the SCIRA Rules of Conduct, as interpreted by the Class Representative.
- Changes to the Racing Rules (RRS) and Rules of conduct will be as follows:
- No national prescriptions will apply.
- RRS Appendix P will apply.
- RRS 35 will be changed to provide that boats not finishing within 30 minutes after the first boat to finish will be scored "Did Not Finish" without a hearing.
- RS 62.2 and 66 will be changed to shorten the time for requesting redress and the requesting that a hearing be re-opened on the last day of racing.
- RRS 30.3 will not be used.
- RRS 32.2 and 33 will be changed to limit course changes
- RRS 60.1(a) will be changed to restrict protest from boats for specific items on the NOR and SI.
- RSS 64.2 will be changed to compel the Jury/PC to abandon a race as required by RoC 18.
- If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.

ADVERTISING:

- Advertising is permitted as per ISAF Regulation 20 and Snipe Class Rules.
 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.
- At the discretion of the Organizing Authority or the Race Committee boats may be required to have further identification on their hulls which shall be provided by the Organizing Authority or the Race Committee.

ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY:

SCIRA USA Junior Championship Regatta: This regatta is open to SCIRA registered boats and Class Member skippers and crews who are USA citizens, or a USA resident of at least one year, who are in good standing with SCIRA-USA for the current year and will not be 22 years of age or older as of December 31, 2013. Crews not meeting citizenship or residency requirement may apply to the SCIRA USA National Secretary for a waiver.

SCIRA USA Special Junior Championship Regatta: This regatta is open to SCIRA registered boats and Class Member skippers and crews who are USA citizens, or a USA resident of at least one year, who are in good standing with SCIRA-USA for the current year and the skipper will not be 22 years of age or older as of December 31, 2013. The crew may be any age, but must be a current SCIRA Member and a USA citizen, or a USA resident of at least one year. Crews not meeting citizenship or residency requirement may apply to the SCIRA USA National Secretary for a waiver.

SCIRA USA National Championship Regatta (Crosby, Heinzerling and Wells Series):

This regatta is open to SCIRA registered boats and Class Member skippers and crews who are in good standing with SCIRA for the current year.

SCIRA USA National Championship Regatta (Wells Series only): This regatta is open to SCIRA registered boats and Class Member skippers and crews who are in good standing with SCIRA for the current year.

- Only participants that are US citizens or that have been residents of the US for at least one year
 and are members in good standing of SCIRA International and SCIRA USA are eligible to win any
 US Perpetual Trophies awarded at the 2013 US National Championship.
- Only participants that are US citizens or that have been residents of the US for at least one year
 and are members in good standing of SCIRA International and SCIRA USA are eligible to qualify
 to represent the United States at any international events for which the 2013 US National
 Championship is a qualifying event, subject to the restrictions on eligibility applicable to nonresident
 US citizens as set forth in SCIRA USA's Policy on Eligibility of Residents of US
 Territories Who Are US Citizens for US Qualifying Positions for International Events, as adopted
 by SCIRA USA on February 18, 2010.
- At the time of registration for any of the above events, both skipper and crew must be paid
 members in good standing with SCIRA, or SCIRA USA, the boat hull being used and the boat hull
 for the sail number being used must be currently registered with SCIRA, and must complete
 registration and pay all fees associated with the events(s) being sailed. No skipper or crew shall
 be eligible to enter any of the above events unless their memberships and their boat hull and sail
 registrations are verified by the Organizing Authority.

REGISTRATION:

Entries for the SCIRA USA National Championship Regatta (Crosby, Heinzerling and Wells Series) and the Wells Series receiveded after June 20, 2013 shall be subject to a \$50 late fee in addition to the

stated Entry Fee. Entries for the SCIRA USA Junior and Special Junior National Championship Regattas received after June 19, 2013 shall be subject to a \$25 late fee in addition to the stated Entry Fee. Registration for the SCIRA USA Junior and Special Junior National Championships will close at 5:00pm on Friday, July 19, 2013. Registration for the SCIRA USA National Championship regattas will close 3:30pm on Sunday, July 21, 2013.

Registration for the events may be made:

- 1. **Online** by completing the Registration Form on the BCC website at: www.buffalocanoeclub.com and faxing or emailing the form to the club. The entry fee will be paid onsite at the Club during the registration period. Registrations received that are after June 20, 2013 will be subject to a \$50 late fee.
- 2. **On Site by** completing the registration form and making the required payment, including Late Fee, at the registration desk during the registration period.

All participants in the Events are required to report to the Host Club registration desk during the period registration is open to complete and confirm their registration for the event.

Racing: In the case for all Series, the Race Committee reserves the right to hold more or fewer races each day except that no more than three (3) races may be held each day.

Junior and Special Junior Events:

Saturday, July 20 – 11:00 First warning signal Sunday, July 21 – 9:30 First warning Signal The Race Committee will attempt to run three races each day. Two completed races shall constitute a Series.

No warning signal will be made after 1:30 on Sunday, July 21.

Crosby Series:

Monday and Tuesday July 22 and 23 . Two races each day with first race warning signal at 11:00am. If one or more races are completed on Monday and/or Tuesday July 22 and/or 23 the races completed shall constitute the Series, subject to the scoring provisions below. If no races have been completed on Monday or Tuesday, June 22 or 23, a third day on June 24 shall be utilized for the Series and the series shall be limited to races completed that day.

Heinzerling Series:

Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, June 24, 25, & 26.
Two races each day with first race warning signal at 11:00am.
Three completed races shall constitute a Series (including Crosby Series as one race).
No warning signal shall be made after 3:00 on Friday, July 26.

Wells Series:

If sailed, subject to the requirements of the current SCIRA USA National Championship Rules of Conduct, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, June 24, 25, & 26. Two races each day with first race Warning signal after Heinzerling Series start. Two completed races shall constitute a Series.

Abino Bay

COURSES: The courses to be sailed are those approved courses for championship regattas as published in the SCIRA rule book.

SCORING:

- Low Point System as publish in Appendix "A" of RRS shall be used.
- A boat's series score will be a total of her race scores. However a boat will be permitted to discard her worst score when the number of races indicated below have been completed and scored:

Junior and Special Junior after 5 races
 Crosby after 4 races
 Heinzerling after 6 races
 Wells after 6 races

The Crosby finishing position of any competitor participating in the Wells Series will NOT be carried forward to the Wells Series only.

- In the event a Wells Series is not sailed:
 - o all races sailed as part of the Crosby Series shall be scored, without any throw outs, for the purpose of determining the final place in the Crosby Series;
 - each race sailed as part of the Crosby Series shall be scored as a separate race finish in the Heinzerling Series;
 - o if six or more but less than 9 races are scored in the Heinzerling Series, one finish shall be thrown out for the purpose of determining the final place in the Heinzerling Series;
 - o if 9 or more races are scored in the Heinzerling Series, two finishes shall be thrown out for the purpose of determining the final place in the Heinzerling Series.

AWARDS:

SCIRA USA Junior National Championship Regatta:

- o Prizes will be awarded to the top three (3) finishing teams.
- o The winning skipper will be awarded the Commodore Owen E. Duffy Memorial Trophy.
- The winning crew will be awarded the Gilreath Trophy.

SCIRA USA Special Junior National Championship Regatta:

- o Prizes will be awarded to the top three (3) finishing skippers.
- The winning skipper will be awarded the "Old Man" Diaz Trophy

USA National Championship Regatta Crosby Series:

- o Prizes will be awarded to the top five (5) finishing teams.
- o The winning skipper will be awarded the Crosby Memorial Trophy.

USA National Championship Regatta Heinzerling Series:

- o Prizes will be awarded to the top ten (10) finishing teams.
- The winning skipper will be awarded the Commodore Charles E. Heinzerling Trophy.
- The winning crew will be awarded the Portage Lakes Yacht Club Trophy.
- o The second place team will be awarded the Slauson Memorial Trophy.

 The highest placing woman (skipper or crew) in the Heinzerling Series will be awarded the Eleanor Williams Memorial Trophy.

SCIRA USA National Championship Regatta Wells Series:

- o Prizes will be awarded to the top five (5) finishing teams.
- The winning skipper will be awarded the Wells Trophy.

Other Prizes:

- Harold Griffith Trophy Awarded to the skipper with the best total point score in the combined Crosby and Heinzerling Series.
- Macklanburg-Duncan Trophy Awarded to the Chairman of the Race Committee for the SCIRA USA National Championship.
- o National Secretary Trophy Awarded to the USA National Championship Regatta Chair Person.
- o Carolyn Nute Memorial Trophy Awarded to the highest placing married couple.
- o Masters Trophy Awarded to the highest placing master skipper.
- Masters Endurance Trophy Awarded to the oldest skipper entered in the Crosby and Heinzerling or Wells Series.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENT:

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third party liability insurance.

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR SUBSEQUENT EVENT:

The top three (3) USA teams from the Heinzerling series qualify to represent SCIRA USA at the 2014 Western Hemisphere & Orient Championship in San Diego. Qualification is subject to the eligibility restrictions as stated in the subsequent even Deeds of Gift. The team eligibility and selection process is outlined on the SCIRA USA website at *snipeus.org*

Regatta Logistics & Area Information

PASSPORTS & BORDER CROSSING:

The Buffalo Canoe Club is located in Ontario, Canada, 15-20 minutes from the US border (Peace Bridge). **Everyone, regardless of age is required to present a valid passport or Nexus card to cross the border**. Minors not crossing the border with their parents should have a letter from their parents explaining the purpose of the trip and giving permission to their guardians to take them across the border.

Trailering of boats across the border is a common event. Ownership papers and trailer registration are rarely asked for, but it is advisable that you have these. Ownership papers can be an informal typed document with hull number, year built, builder, date purchased, from whom, and the owner's address and signature. It is important to tell the customs official that the boat and all its equipment will be returning to the USA after the regatta.

Rush-hour crossings of the border should be avoided as should crossing the border on weekends from 12:00 – 2:00. Only alcohol bought at Duty Free before crossing the border can be taken into Canada. Do not cross the border with tobacco or other substances.

AIRPORTS & SHUTTLE SERVICES:

The **Buffalo Niagara International Airport** (BUF) is located 15 minutes from the US/Canadian border. Most major airlines including Southwest, Air Tran, and Jet Blue fly to Buffalo. **The Toronto Pearson International Airport** (YYZ) is an hour and half drive from the BCC. Toronto offers more direct flights from major international cities. International competitors not wishing to have both a US and Canadian visa should consider flying into Toronto. The **Hamilton International Airport** (YHM) is located 45 minutes from the BCC. Canadian budget airline, **West Jet**, flies into Hamilton and Toronto and more than 80 US cities, as well as Nassau and Mexico.

The **Niagara Airbus** provides shuttle bus service from all the region's airports to Fort Erie (Canadian border town, 15 minutes from the club). For schedule & reservations: www.niagaraairbus.net.

CHILDCARE:

Abino Bay is safe family environment. Children will be well entertained on the club's grounds – beach & swimming docks, beach volleyball, playground, tennis courts, snack bar, and local bike path. Subsidized babysitting at the club for competitors' children (ages 3-11) will be offered from 9:30-4:00 on race days during the Crosby and Heinzerling Series. **Reservations must be made no later than June 10** – no exceptions. Motels & Hotels:

Limited rooms are available 2 miles from the club at the simple Crystal Beach Motel and Lakeside Suites. More upscale chain hotels are located within a 15 minute drive from the club in the town of Fort Erie: Clarion Hotel (closest), Comfort Inn, & the Econo Lodge.

Camping:

Camping is not allowed on club grounds, but available within an 8 minute drive from the club at Knights Hideaway Campground: www.knightsfamilycamping.com or a 12 minute drive from the club at the more picturesque Sherkston family resort: www.sherkston.com.

CURRENCY:

US and Canadian currencies are accepted at the toll at the Canadian Border as well as EZ Pass. US currency is accepted at most stores and restaurants in the area, but usually not at par. Both currencies are accepted at the BCC.

BOAT STORAGE & LAUNCHING:

All boats will be stored in the club drysail area. The BCC is located on a 2 mile sand beach. There is a large ramp that leads to the water's edge. It is **recommended that all boats use dollies** as there is no hoist and the water level of the lake can fluctuate drastically.

CHARTERS

Many charters are available for the Jr. Nationals, but are limited for the Nationals. Priority will be given to US residents traveling the furthest, juniors, and international teams. Contact: ktocke@hotmail.com.
