HULL AND HULL FITTINGS

- ☐ Floor boards (Non-skid finish)
- ☐ Hiking Straps (check both anchoring screws and strap material. Proper length?)

ADJUSTMENTS

- ☐ Vang (rope or wire and all blocks & cleats)
- ☐ Cunningham (line and all blocks & cleats)
- ☐ Mast Puller (wire and all blocks & cleats)
- ☐ Traveller
- ☐ Traveler Control
- ☐ Main Cleat(s)
- ☐ Jib Cleat(s)
- ☐ Fairleads (If adjustable do they adjust easily)
- ☐ Tracks (Proper length and placement)

Now is the time to check fitting layout and change anything that is inconvenient or inoperative. Pullers must pull, cleats must cleat (and release).

MAST AND BOOM

- ☐ No sign of Wear or corrosion
- ☐ Rudder pin to prevent rudder pop-up in planing or loss in capsizing
- ☐ Tiller extension (should swivel)

- ☐ Battens
- ☐ Batten Pockets
- ☐ Numbers
- ☐ Jib Wire and grips

- ☐ Bolt Rope
- ☐ Condition (Do you really need new sails)

WHISKER POLE

- ☐ Strong and straight
- ☐ End fitting and release (should work easily and remain attached in jibing)

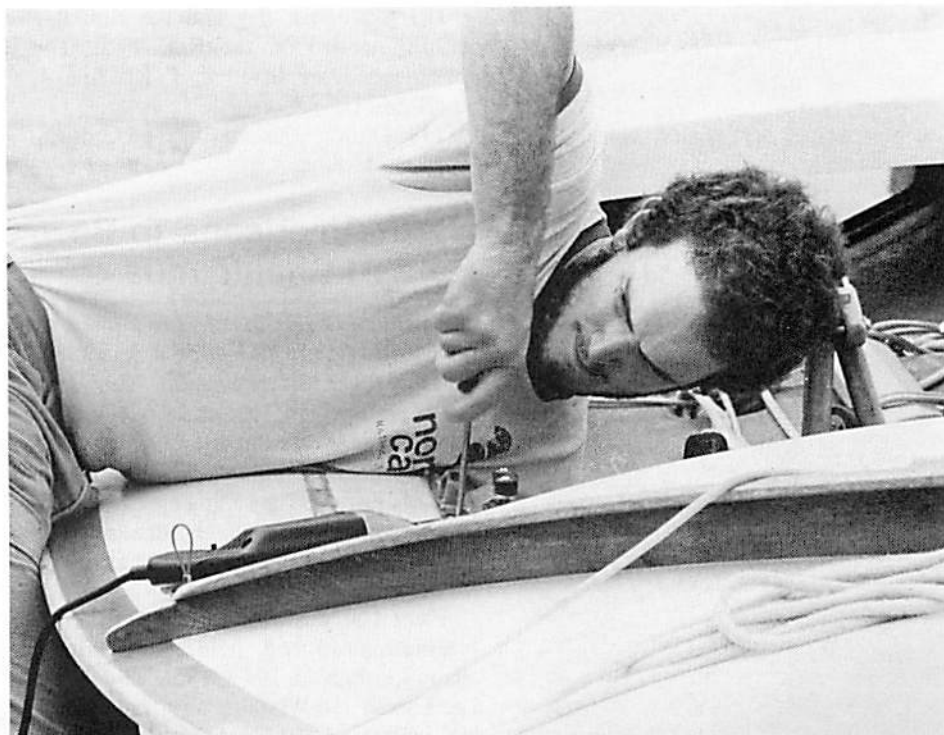

The Commodore Believes

I believe that:

"Nothing is more frustrating than a
bad R.C. . ."

I believe it was Confucius, the Chinese
thinking sailor, that proposed several lit-
tle Chinese rules that ought to be ob-
served by Race Committees. The ones I
can remember:

1) At the R.C. boat, at least one
should know where the wind is coming
from. He should be the only leader.

2) Eight persons at a R.C. boat, at
least five are fisherman or tourists.

3) Shot guns fail. Bells and whistles
usually don't. Remember only starting
sound signals may fail. Others may not.

4) From each ten general recalls, nine
are R.C. faults.

5) Try to give them a starting line, not
a starting point.

6) After a general recall don't be lazy.
Shift the mark or the R.C. boat, and cor-
rect the line. Don't be timid as usual.
Move it enough, before the second try.

7) Shift the leeward mark just after
the start. It is easier. If it needs shifting,
don't be timid, as usual. Move it enough.

8) From each ten mark shiftings, nine
are timid.

9) Fast motor boats are much better
than lousy radios.

10) Afganistan flag and the club flag
are not needed on the R.C. boat. The
ones needed are listed in IYRU rule 4,
plus T and C.

11) During the starting procedures,

when Mr. Bore asks you: "What flag is
that?" Ask him back: "Which?" If he in-
sists, answer him: "I don't remember. . ."

12) If he asks: "Where is the windward
mark?" Answer: "To windward of the
leeward one." Or answer, "In the water."
That should take care of that question.

13) And during the finishing proce-
dures if Mr. Bore comes as usually and
ask you: "Which place did I get?" Answer
him: "Just behind the one that crossed
the line in front of you." If he insists,
answer him: "Just before the one that
crossed the line after you." Better than
that, invite Mr. Bore to work with you in
the next regatta. He will then learn, for
sure.

14) Good R.C.s are not protested.
They are thanked and applauded.

North Americans To Be Held At Chautauqua

Chautauqua NY is the site chosen by
the North American National Secretaries
for the 1979 Championship. The dates
are September 14, 15, and 16. Chautau-
qua Lake is located in the southwest cor-
ner of New York State, 70 miles south-
west of Buffalo. The sailing area is 5 miles
by 1½ miles, and launch, docking and
motel facilities are more than adequate
for large regattas.

Fleet 124 was host to the 1946 Snipe
Internationals, and held US National
championships in 1949, 1958, and 1966.
Les Larson, 10 Winding Way, Lakewood,
NY 14750 is 1979 Fleet Captain, and will
be chairman for the event.

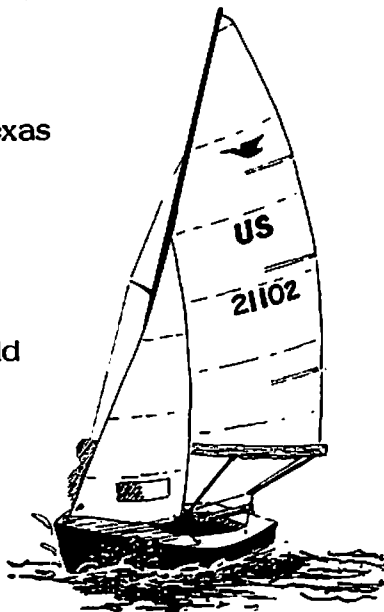

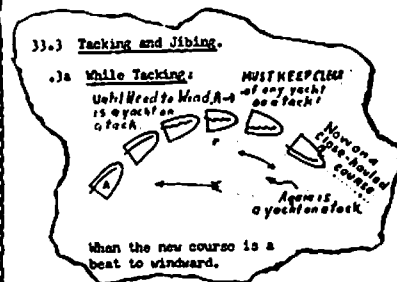

Davis Earns Perfect High Point Score

Takes U.S. and World Championships to achieve top rank for the third time in four years.

Henry Davis of Omaha's Iowa-Nebraska Sailing Association Fleet 309, is a perfectionist. In winning the Reichner (World's) and Minneford (U.S.) High Point Championships he turned in a perfect score for the third time in four years.

Henry won both trophies for the 1975 season, but lost the tie breaker to Dan Blodgett for 1976. Last year he was third, with one less than perfect race. Henry is current District II Champion and last year, retired the Missouri Valley Championship trophy by winning it 3 times in its 27 year history.

The Omaha Fleet also wins activity honors with both Bob Jones and Tom Hood turning in scores for 44 races. Congratulations to one of SCIRA's "backbone" fleets.

Jesse Aronstein, Galway Lake, NY, another familiar name, moved up from 6th to second place in the standings. Last year's champion, Les Larson, Chautauqua Fleet Captain, was 3rd with 1734.2. Board of Governors member Bob Hill earned 4th place for the Acton Lake, OH, Fleet with 1723.9. Larry Colter of Evergreen Lake, IL, rounded out the top 5.

Charles Webster, Fairport, NY, sailing Shady Too, the oldest boat in competition for the trophy, was 6th at 1713.7, shading Erkki Lutha of Helsinki, Finland, by 3 tenths of a point. Van Elston, La Crosse, and Jack Wagener, Lincoln, tied for 8th, with identical scores for 16 races. Phil Tanski, Chippewa, was 10th. As the only other boat with more than 1700 points, Pete Fenner, Dallas, Fleet 1, earned an honorable mention in 11th place.

Only Finland's Helsinki Fleet, and England's Budworth, turned in scores from outside the United States. All Fleet Captains are urged to submit their 1979 scores before February 1, 1980, for inclusion in next year's standings.

Seattle Sailboat Show Features Snipe Display

The Snipe fleets in the Seattle-Tacoma area received a big promotional boost during a sailboats-only show in mid-March at Seattle's Southcenter Mall. The show was featured as an added attraction during a spring weekend shopping sale. 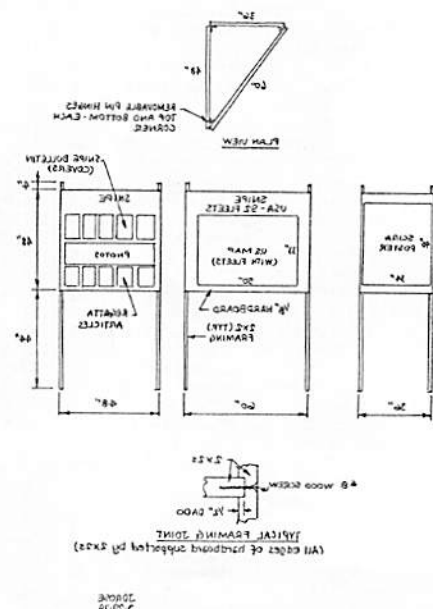

A bright-red Chubasco Snipe (Ed Kane's "Scorpion," No. 19381) was the



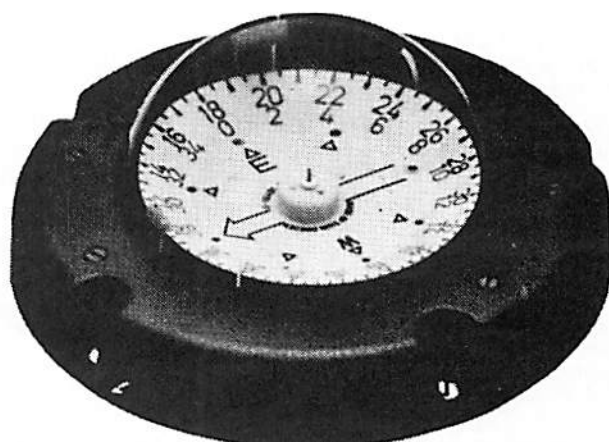
