Snipe Sailors Remembered

Margaret Boswell: Margaret Boswell was proud to be the first, and so far, only female to win the Hayward Western Hemisphere Trophy. Margaret, crewing for husband Gary, won the 1970 WH Championship sailed in Spanish Point, Bermuda in light air against the likes of the Schmidt brothers, Elms, Kelly, Simmons, Siegenthaler, Ninomiya and other great sailors. Margaret was also the recipient of the Eleanor Williams Memorial trophy in 1970 as the highest placing female in the US Nationals. She is survived by her husband Gary in Texas.

Pierre Siegenthaler: Pierre was known as "Powerful Pierre" and represented SCIRA in many World and Western Hemisphere championships. Pierre was born in Switzerland, where he ultimately met his death in an avalanche. Pierre lived in many parts of the world including the Bahamas and most recently the Turks and Caicos Islands. Besides sailing Snipes, Pierre was also World Sunfish Champion. He is survived by his wife Karen and their daughter.

1997 Brazilian National Championship

This year the Brazilian National Championship was held in São Paulo at Guarapiranga Lake, with lots of rain and generally mild wind. The tune-up race was on Sunday, Jan. 26, with a low attendance since finishing this race is considered to bring bad luck for the rest of the series. Of the 67 registered boats only 21 crossed the finish line. Talk about a bunch of superstitious sailors!

Due to the large number of entries, the competitors were divided into 4 groups sailing round robin on 2 race courses. On each course the race committee was instructed to follow the fleet downwind and yellow flag any overeager crew considered to be using illegal propulsion. The crew would then have to do the circles right there and then to avoid disqualification. Quite a few boats had to bite the bullet and pay the alternative penalty during the series.

The first race with light and shifty winds out of the Northeast had André Fonseca (Junior World Champion of 96) lead the fleet across the finish line on course 2 while Paulo Santos, after rounding the next to the last mark way down in the fleet, picked up some favorable shifts on the next two legs, to finish first on course 3.

Races 2 and 3 were held on January 28, again with light winds out of the Northeast. The first race of the day had Ivan Pimentel and Ricardo Paradeda winning respectively on courses 2 and 3. For the second race that day the groups changed courses and with the wind dying down, the race committees decided to use a windward-leeward course. Course 2 saw Frederico Vasconcelos and his brother Felipe as crew leading most of the way to take the honors at the finish line, while Fernando Kessler and Eduardo Rocha were first on course 3.

After an evening of thunderstorms, Wednesday, Jan. 29 dawned without rain, unlike the preceding two days. Winds were steady from the North at about 8 knots, lightening considerably to the end of the race. On course 2 Axel Frisch/Carmen Lindemann and Ricardo Paradeda/Henrique de Lorenzi sailed off to an early lead. At the finish line it was Ricardo Paradeda leading with Axel Frisch in second. Since Ricardo was later disqualified, top honors for this course were awarded to Axel Frisch and Carmen Lindemann. On course 3 the winners were Alexandre Paradeda and Flavio Fernandes.


These first four races comprised the qualifying series with 34 boats out of the 67 originally registered competing for the National Championship on course 3. The rest would be competing on course 2 as the Silver fleet.

Thursday began as a lovely sunny day, with winds varying from 12-15 knots, out of the Northeast, more typical of São Paulo in the month of January. In the Championship fleet Alexandre Paradeda sailed a very consistent race to finish first.

The sixth race was sailed under the same weather conditions as the day before, with Paulo Santos leading at the finish line. Eduardo Florêncio/Eduardo Neves were second with Alexandre Paradeda in third, wrapping up the Championship with this result, without having to sail the last race.

Saturday, February 1, brought a surprise to all

since at race time the winds were howling from the Northeast at 20 knots. with gusts up to 28 knots. The race committee decided to postpone for a couple of hours to let the wind settle. about 2:00 p.m. the wind

and Luciano Lopez in first for the race and placing

with gusts at around 22 second overall in the Championship. In the Silve

second overall in the Championship. In the Silver fleet only Abílio do Amaral crossed the finish line, without the jib since the halyard had given up during the last windward leg.

In the evening the Clube de Campo de São Paulo offered a lovely dinner where the awards were given to the 10 first of the Championship fleet, the first 8 from the Silver group, the first 3 Juniors, Masters and Women Skippers.

Snipe North Americans Canadian Style "Eh"

Prior to 1973 the Snipe Class did not have a North American Championship. A group of Snipers in Oakville, Ontario decided it was time to get into the big leagues and approached Doug Keary, a fellow Sniper and independent businessman to present a trophy which was called the InterNorth Cup.

Fleet 321 went ahead and proclaimed 1973 as the start up regatta which was held in Oakville and won by noted Sniper sailor Don Hite and so it all began.

When Birney Mills, Executive Secretary of the Class, died in 1970, SCIRA took over the regatta and it became the Birney Mills Memorial.

1997 will again see Oakville host the NAs and we hope to see many Snipers come and see where it all began 24 years ago, to sample the infamous Green Can and memories of Steve Callison winning a midnight race for champagne over a fleet of 12 Green Canned Snipers with no collisions on a very dark night.

1996 SCIRA High Point Championship Trophies

Bob and Sandy Rowland Take Overall Trophies

Bob and Sandy Rowland, hailing from Cowan Lake, Ohio, took this year's Reichner (International High Point) Trophy and the Minneford (US National) Trophy by 1 point over last year's winner Neil Martin of the UK. Bob and Sandy sailed 14 races while Neil lodged 24 with his fleet. The top five were rounded out by Henry Davis, INSA, Howard Wolff of Chippewa Lake, Ohio and Jim Richter of Indianapolis, IN.

The scoring for these trophies is a unique combination of positions

placed averaged over the number of races sailed. Total reporting was down this year to 127 competitors compared to 1995 with 186.

Cliff Browning of Indianapolis sailed the most races with 41, while there were 11 boats competing under number 20,000; the oldest being Don Jones of Lincoln, Nebraska with hull 15118. For 1996, only 10 fleets of the 373 active fleets participated.


