Gulfcoast Snipe Championship Inaugurated At Bay Waveland YC

Last year, sailors in New Orleans, Louisiana were facing the same problem confronted at many United States clubs — what to do about the anemia in one-design sailing. The number of active local racers had been in decline for years, caught between the expense of new boats, small one design classes and the apparent attraction of handicap sailing.

Solutions had been sought for several years without success until, while searching for a two-man dinghy for the junior program, someone got the bright idea that Snipes might provide the answer to both the junior and one design problems. It sounded like the price tag, sailing simplicity and tactical nature of Snipes could satisfy the juniors' needs, while lighting a fire under the seniors to get back to one designs. A meeting was held, fifteen commitments were made, and before delivery of the first boat, thirty new McLaughlin's were on order.

The next campaign was, and is, in the Gulf Yachting Association — a group of clubs strung along the Gulf Coast from Louisiana through the Florida Panhandle. This is traditionally Flying Scot, Laser and Sunfish territory. As a two-man dinghy, the Snipe is a needed addition to round out the sailing picture in the area.

Snipes have now gained a foothold in Bay Waveland, Gulfport, and Pascagoula, Mississippi and in Mobile, Alabama, with Jackson, Mississippi going strong again. In one year, the Snipe has gone from a little-known class to a fleet of 50 active boats. And that is just the beginning.

We should all be excited about this development. The Gulf Coast clubs provide some of the best year round sailing conditions in the United States. Clubs like Gulfport, Bay Waveland, Southern and Mobile are much sought after as venues for national and international championships. The local presence of Snipes will assure our welcome and some fine regattas in the years to come.

The first sanctioned regatta in the GYA, the Gulfcoast Snipe Championship, will be held on April 9-10 at Bay Waveland Yacht Club in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi. It is scheduled as a five race series with registration at 10:00 a.m. Saturday.

We asked the BWYC to host this regatta because of their first-rate race committee work and because the Bay provides an interesting combination of lake sailing conditions with a seabreeze.

The Mississippi Gulf Coast is also a great place to visit. Less than an hour from New Orleans, it is a weekend vacation spot with white sand beaches, great restaurants, night clubs and lots of accommodations of both the motel and camping varieties. You might try one of these:

Mark, DeAnn Reynolds Are North American Champs

Lenhart cops close second at Mission Bay

Mark and De Ann Reynolds of host fleet Mission Bay were the best of the forty-boat fleet assembled for the 1982 North American Championship October 1st through 3rd at Mission Bay, California. World Champion Jeff Lenhart was a close second. Neither Mark nor Jeff had to sail the last race to maintain his finish position. Roger Stewart was third, Chris Rabb fourth, and Grant Hill fifth. Craig Martin with finishes of 3-5-1 for the first three races, was in contention for the top spot until a breakdown took him out of the fourth race. He finished a disappointing 19th for the series.

Helen Bedford, Race Committee Chairman, set long courses for the six races sailed in beautiful weather on the Pacific Ocean.

On Friday two races were sailed in winds of 15 to 18. For the first race the right side of the course was favored. Mark Reynolds started back in the pack, but worked his way out to finish first, with Jeff second, and Craig Martin third. Mark Folkman, new to the Snipe Class, finished a creditable fourth in the race.

The second race was sailed in much the same conditions, with the first two finishing positions being the same. Jeff was ahead of Mark, with positions being Chris Rabb, Argyle Campbell, Jeff, and Mark: when "the first guy around led us astray" according to Jeff. Finishers behind Mark and Jeff for the second race were Argyle Campbell, Chris Rabb, and Craig Martin.

On Saturday winds were a little lighter

and courses a little shorter. The left side of the course paid off for the first race, won by Craig Martin, with Hachiwaka of Japan in second place. Reynolds was third, with Grant Hill fourth, and Roger Stewart fifth.

In the fourth race Jeff led all the way. Craig Martin, in second place at the time, broke his rudder and retired from the race. Argyle Campbell also had a boat problem, and dropped to 13th place. Reynolds passed Mark Folkman going to the finish, and they finished second and third. Steve Garland was fourth and Grant Hill fifth.

In the fifth race, if Reynolds won, he would not have to sail the last race. He crossed Jeff after the start to get to the favored side of the course. They chased each other to the finish, with Mark finishing first, and Jeff second. Steve Garland, Mark Butler, and Jim Maloney followed in that order.

The last race, sailed in light air, was an anti-climax, since the top two positions were already decided. Keith Dodson won the race with Hachiwaka second, followed by Greg Morton, Jeff Lenhart, and Roger Stewart.

Beer kegs were provided for after race dockside entertainment by McLaughlin Boats, Jay Butler Marine, Pacesetter Boats, and Tom Nute of North Sails.

Parties included a dance with a live band and a hamburger cookout, and trophy presentation. Trophies were impressive line drawings done for the occasion by Doug Sharp.

Doug deSouza was regatta chairman.

A Practical Sailor's Guide To Snipe Fittings





District I Champion Ed Adams furnished the following captions for pictures of fittings taken at the 1982 Nationals:

PHOTO 1 (rudder fitting): This is a Seasure rudder fitting, made in England and bought through Afterguard Marine in New Haven, CT (tel: 203-562-4430). Seasure rudder fittings come in several sizes and in two configurations: Pintle on the stern or pintle on the rudder. The pins are stainless steel; all other parts are precision-machined black anodized aluminum. They are much lighter (because of the aluminum), much stronger (because they are not welded), fit with far less play, and are only marginally more expensive than all-stainless American-made fittings used as stock equipment on most Snipes.

The washers and safety pin shown in the photo are my method of keeping the rudder from floating off the pintles, although a standard pivoting stop would probably be better. The safety pin and drain plug are wired to the pintle to prevent them from being lost or stolen.

PHOTO 2 (jib leads): This is a simple way to rig a jib lead which can be adjusted from the weather rail. The jib sheet is led through the bullet block shown, then runs aft to a through-deck block behind the skipper, forward under the

deck, exiting through a can cleat mounted on an angle iron.

The sheet lead is then adjusted by pulling the bullet block down (for light air) or letting it up (for heavy air). The line which controls the bullet block is marked for easy reference on the scale shown. The line leads forward to blocks mounted under the foredeck, and then back to a clam cleat on the weather rail. The second line attached to the bullet block, which leads outboard and through the deck, was intended as a barber hauler for upwind use. I have found that it is not necessary; by simply adjusting the up-down control line for more twist, the jib can be adequately depowered in a strong breeze.

Another advantage of this system is that there is no track and car for the crew to bruise her legs on. A disadvantage is that the sheet can drop over the angle iron-mounted can cleat, which can foul up a tack if the crew does not consciously clear it. Also, if the skipper sits on the sheet, the tack is slowed.

This system is a real advantage on an open water course, where tacks are few, when used with a 4.1 ounce jib. A 3.3 ounce jib has a more flexible leech; because it is more "selfadjusting," it does not need adjustable lead. However, a 3.3 ounce jib has less than half the competitive life of a 4.1 ounce jib, so an adjustable jib lead is more economical.
