### The INTERNATIONAL Snipe Class

On June 19th, the International Yacht Racing Union officially  
confirmed that the Permanent Committee of the Union has  
finally granted

INTERNATIONAL STATUS TO THE SNIPE CLASS.

The current rules for the adoption and control of the inter-  
national classes are found on pages 29 and 30 of the Union's  
1959 Rule Book.

Thus the culmination of a 2 year effort started under  
Commodore Terry Whittemore's regime brings greater success  
to SCIRA and an enhancement of its reputation and position  
throughout the world. The Star Class is the only other U.S.  
designed boat to have such recognition. Official action by the  
Board of Governors will probably be taken at the Oklahoma  
meeting.

### The 1959 U.S. Nationals

The U.S. National Championship Races promise to be a mos-  
exciting, hard-fought battle this year. Competition will really  
be tough, for the rewards are higher than usual. In addition to  
the National honor, the victorious team will represent the U.S. in  
the Pan-American Games in Chicago over Labor Day and then  
have the thrilling trip to the World Championship Series at Porto  
Alegre, Brazil, in October. Really top honors for any sailor and  
rewards unsurpassed by other competitive classes. So go to  
Oklahoma for the "fightiest" time of your competitive life and  
be well prepared.

Ted's column this month gives warning of rule committee  
policy. Weighing and measuring starts Wednesday, July 29th  
and there is no sail-maker in the area. Boats and sails must  
qualify in every respect, so make a careful check before you  
leave home and avoid unpleasant situations. Don't let ignorance  
of the rules or carelessness in observing them mar your arrival.  
Really no excuse for arguments over equipment at a national  
event. Complete information is in the Rule Book — the Juniors  
under the Duffy Trophy and the Seniors from the Heinzerling,  
Wells, and Crosby Series. In general, the rules are the same  
as last year. GOOD LUCK!

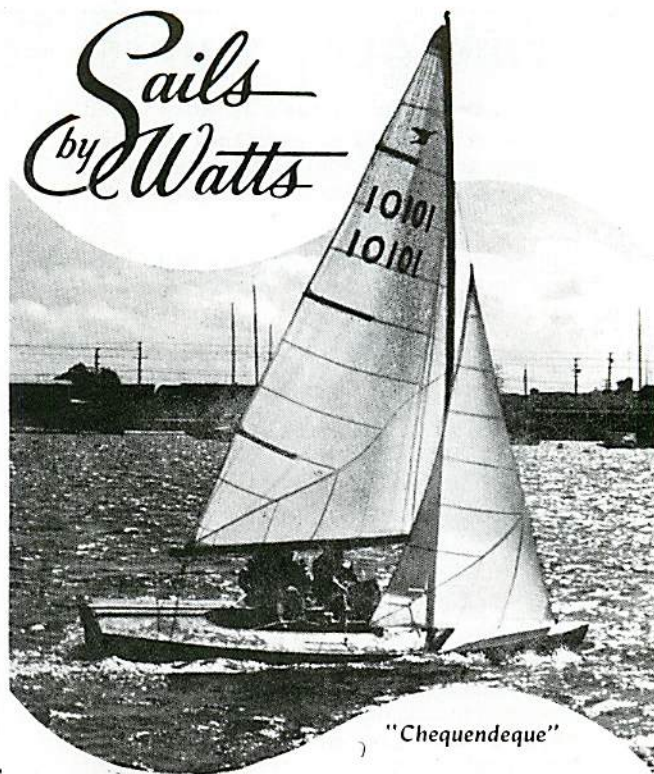

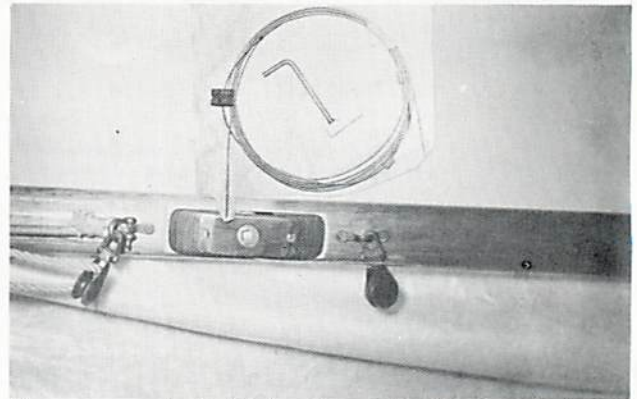

# REICHNER TROPHY RETURNS TO UNITED STATES

## HARDEY ALSO WINS MINNEFORD TROPHY

Charles Hardey of Fleet 38, Shreveport, Louisiana, made a clean sweep of the high point score races when he won both the International and U. S. National Championships by turning in a score of 1741.22 points for 18 races.

Martin Hellar, Galway (N. Y. ) 412, who was 5th in 1956 and 4th in 1957, continued his climb to the top spot with 1735.3 for 2nd place in final standings; likewise, Dan Williams, Privateer 142, moved from 7th to 3rd place with 1734.2.

Emilio Salvi, Pernambuco 211 (Brazil), joint holder of the International Reichner Trophy with Portugal in 1956 and last year's sole winner, dropped to 4th place with his 1720. Carlos Bosch of Cuba held the title in 1955, so, after an absence of 3 years, the oldest trophy in SCIRA returns to the U. S. Bermuda, Canada, and Portugal also placed high in international competition.

As Hardey's score was also the top among U. S. skippers, he gains possession of the Minneford Trophy, emblematic of the U. S. National High Point Championship. However, some sort of recognition should go to James Morris, Miami 7, for his hard work in sailing in 38 races and scoring 1502.6; also, to Norma Smith, likewise of Miami, who got 1589.15 in 33 races. They really love Snipe sailing!

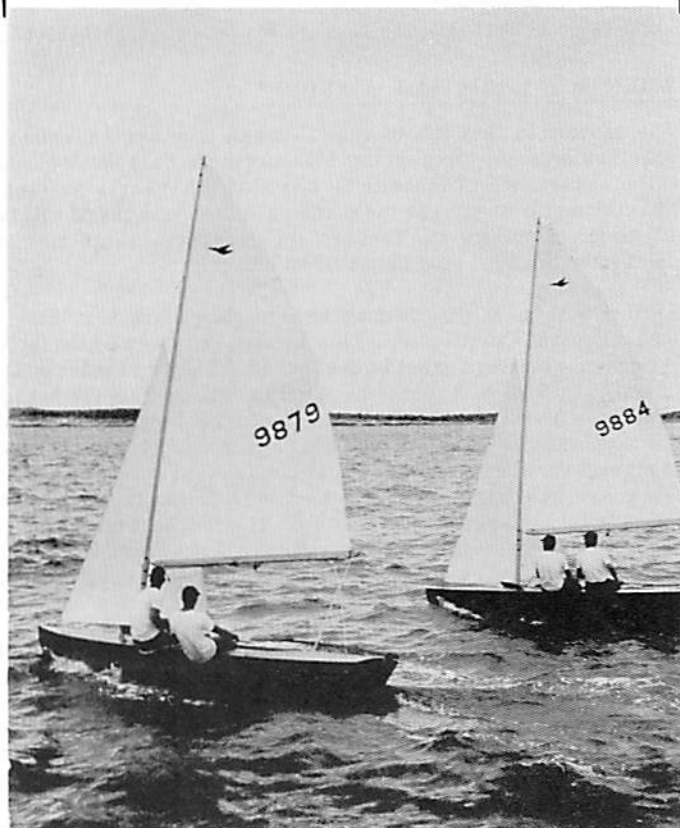

**WHEN IS A SNIPE NOT A SNIPE ?**

The answer to this is obvious -- when it doesn't meet the requirements set forth on the Measurement Data Sheet! And if the experience of measuring boats at this year's National Championship Regatta is the same as in the past, there will be a number of owners who find that (by the above definition) they don't have Snipes. And they will be unhappy!

Section 5 of the SCIRA By-laws says that each boat must have a Measurement Certificate. This means that even boats from recognized builders must be measured. They can make mistakes, too. Just last week, the Wichita Sailing Club checked a boat from a well-known builder and found the daggerboard 1/16" too wide and 3/8" too long and the daggerboard trunk 1/2" too long; and the sheer width 1/4" over maximum at one point. A few years ago, boats from another well-known builder were found to be too narrow at #1 chine. The fact that such errors as this can persist for some time causes a suspicion that there are fleets where measuring consists of filling out a sheet, collecting dues, and addressing an envelope.

Boats built by amateurs don't ordinarily have such trouble at the Nationals, unless the builders have tried to use maximum tolerances instead of trying to build to nominal dimensions, using the tolerances for what they were meant for, which is to take care of errors. (Boats built by amateurs are usually checked carefully before showing up at Nationals.)

Bob Vreeland and Tom Hanna have cooked up a very good system for using a trailer for the base line in measuring. This was described in detail in the June BULLETIN. This system can be very accurate if the trailer frame is supported, so that the weight of the boat does not bend the frame and if the straightness of the frame is checked by measuring to a thread stretched tightly from one end to the other. Don't assume it is straight because it looks that way for the chances are that it isn't.

Boats measured carefully by this method (or any other well-planned and carefully executed method) should not have trouble at the Nationals, but some boats will, whether the result of inadequate measuring equipment or just simply no measuring.

The measuring rigs used at Nationals always come in for criticism when a boat doesn't measure in, particularly when it did once before. From this year on, a very accurate jig, owned by SCIRA, will be used at all Nationals and should eliminate this problem.

Which will leave one big problem, which is: how far can or should a measuring committee go in allowing Snipes which technically aren't Snipes to sail in the Nationals? I have news for the SCIRA Board of Governors! The Measurement Committee at this year's Nationals is not going to make the decisions -- the Board of Governors is!

Recent letters advocating a reduction in the minimum weight of Snipe (ready to sail) have brought in many replies. Just to clarify the situation, the subject matter should be defined again. Adoption of the light board produced the problem of what to do with the extra weight difference (as much as 40 to 50 lbs.) -- how and where should it be added to maintain the 425 lbs. present minimum weight. The easiest way is to reduce the minimum weight an average of 40 lbs. to 385 lbs. At no time has any change in the present actual weight or specifications of the hull itself been proposed by anyone. The relationship of all existing hulls would remain the same, as only the overall weight of the boat ready to sail would be reduced -- and that reduction would come out of the board. Please keep this point in mind when arguing the matter.

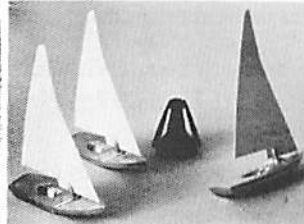
