





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THOUGHTS WHILE SAILING . . .

How to KILL THE CLASS...... No, we have not been taking underground courses in the art of revolution. However, we have been on the job long enough to see what could be a trend toward the death of the Snipe Class. Basically, this is a tendency to ignore or to bend the rules. Apparently, it runs all the way from the ordinary dues payer to the builders and even to the officials. It does not include everyone and I am sure most of you would be shocked. However, it does include enough to indicate a leak in the dike.

Examples?

A regatta held in May had 23 entrants. Of these only 6 had current membership cards. This was a sanctioned regatta and every entrant should have assumed the responsibility for having a proper card. January 1 is the beginning of the racing season, prior to this year it was April 1.

Many instances of boats sailing without proper Measurement Data sheets being recorded have been observed. Measurement sheets have been received with exceptions but still recommended for a Measurement certificate.

A number of improper daggerboards have been found. Not really a serious error, but still another whack. What are we to do about these? Are we going to change the rules as we did when it was found that literally hundreds of $20\frac{1}{2}$ " boards had a 22" radius and vice versa?

And on, and on, and on

The basic foundation of a onedesign class is strict adherence to the rules. No doubt there are many that need revision. But let's do it in the proper manner - through the Rules Committee and Board of Governors, who should act with deliberation. Let us not adopt rules after the fact and have a boat with tolerances great enough for whatever anyone thinks they should be.

Let's follow the rules - have your membership card - boat measured properly - live up to the spirit as well as the letter of the rules. If we do not we are going to end up with no class.

WHAT TO WEAR

The question of what to wear for any specific occasion has intrigued women since Eve had a choice of fig leaves. We who sail find it worthy of consideration, too.

On board a Snipe, things are a little less nautical than they might be on larger yachts. We find chuckles in the fashion sections of some of the boating magazines, imagining those smart togs in our particular situation. One of our skippers did show up one day in nautical whites and was greeted with whistles and questions about sailing on which Cal-40 today. After he finished his race, his whites were no longer white but "mud bottom lake gray." Not all that practical.

Then there's the matter of sun. Since we are out in it enough to get tanned, we are a little careful to get enough tan so that we look all the same color in most of our clothing. Some of us wear bathing suits aboard, which eliminates all problems of untanned areas showing, although it may create a few problems in the way of distractions. And those of us who feel that sailing a Snipe in a bikini is a little like riding a horse in shorts, well we just wear our untanned 'stripes' when we swim.

Major considerations are comfortable fit and quick drying capability. When you find that combination, you'll probably demote your other sailing clothes to the trunk of the car for extra drys.

There's the question of color – do we match our boat, contrast or blend? We have some of each, and some who seem not to have given the matter a thought. Perhaps they were more intent on tuning their boat and sailing to win!

Some sailors wear the same old favorites, which is comfortable but can be dangerous. It was in the case of the Race Committee who diagrammed his course on the chalkboard, and while bending over to explain it, split out the entire back seam.

There are also "lucky shorts" – worn because they are winners. A pair of them made repeated appearances on the beach over several years, finally becoming so tattered they had to be worn over other shorts.

GOING TO ANNAPOLIS

What To Expect.....

Wind and Sea: August winds on the Chesapeake Bay are usually light and variable in the morning but settle at noon time into the southwest with little change in direction at 5 to 15 mph. Occasionally, this sea breeze will continue all night which kicks up a steep 2-foot chop. On weekends, there is considerable motor boat traffic tending to produce a confused sea condition. Late afternoon squalls are common following several days of good sea breezes.

Tide: Maximum current in the racing area is about 1 knot, making it a major factor in strategy when the wind is under 10 knots. The times of ebb and flood are dramatically affected by the wind and changing barometric pressure. (Increasing pressure tends to prolong the ebb; decreasing, the flood.) Local sailors do not rely on the published predictions alone, but they note the strength and direction at every opportunity on marks, anchored boats, and crab pot buoys. (Yes, Annapolis's other name is "Crabtown.") The direction of the tide varies as much as 30° from one side of the racing area to the other. This difference can influence your decision on which tack to take. By postponing a tack directly into the tide, you may be able to lee bow it later on. By tacking earlier, you may be able to avoid having it on your weather bow later in the beat. For downwind sailing, a compass is useful for keeping your course made good straight to the next mark, for the actual heading of the boat may be 10 to 20 degrees off the bearing between the marks.

Racing Area: The best racing near Annapolis for Snipes is off the mouth of the Severn River in Chesapeake Bay, about 2 miles from the Severn Sailing Association. Most local sailors stock up on Gatorade, or equivalent, to be sure to have some in a thermos to sip on downwind legs and between races. Temperatures average between 90 to 100 degrees during the day. It will not be possible to sail in to the Club after finishing one race, and be able to make it out in

Schedule: The racing schedule is set to have three races on most days because we wish to be able to take advantage of excellent racing conditions when they occur. Spectators: Boats will be available to take wives, friends, and parents out to the racing area. Please bring your own lunch and foul weather gear (in case of squalls).

Repairs: Several ship chandlers, sailmakers, and boatyards are located right in Annapolis.

Race Committee: We are fortunate that Steve Taylor will be calling the shots again for the Nationals this year. He will be assisted by locals who can help Steve with weather, tide, and other local knowledge necessary to do a top notch job. We will have separate courses for the Heinzerling and Wells series to insure no interference.

We hope that you will find sailing on the Chesapeake as much fun and as rewarding as we do. As your hosts, we will expect you to ask for information and help. We will be disappointed if you don't. We will be even more disappointed if you don't come.

Does Your Boat Have A Case Of The Slows?

The following articles tries to depict the changes and improvements made to my Lofland Snipe No. 17171. You may try all or just a few of these changes depending on your local sailing conditions and on the equipment of the other boats in your fleet. If all the boats in your area use deck - stepped wood masts you don't really have to have a keel stepped alloy masts to be competitive, but if you are the only deck stepped wood mast in a jungle of Cobras and Proctors, then the portion of this article refering to masts will be useful. By the way, all the changes about to be mentioned won't make your boat the "Fastest Snipe" but will probably improve it enough so you and fellow fleet members will notice the difference.

Centerboard: Switching to a cut-off (straight-edge) board made a big difference in performance to windward. This switch triggered all the other changes as it gave me confidence in the boat. My present board is alloy, 21 inches wide and 6½ inches at the deep end.

Weight Distribution: Let's start by stating a well known fact. "You must concentrate weight around the center of gravity of the boat and keep the bow and transom areas as lightweight as possible."

The first step I took in this direction was the removal of the floorboards. My boat floorboards weighted 30 lbs. and were made of fiberglass. I took them off and replaced the lost weight with lead placed around the aft end of the C. B. trunk. Do not fear stepping on the bare bottom of the boat. I do it freely and if at 225 lbs. I don't make holes, you won't either. Be careful about the distribution of gear around your boat. Why carry a 10 lbs. anchor and line next to the transom? This item should be placed as close as possible to the C. B. trunk.

My second and most drastic attack on weight distribution was to remove the original and very nose heavy glass deck



and replace them with a ¼ inch plywood structure. I used "Building a Plywood Snipe" as reference and in 48 hours installed the new deck. This deck of mine is somewhat flimsy but it keeps the waves out and I can sit on it which is the function of a deck. If you also want it pretty then take your time. This big step oddly enough produced the least benefit although it surely helps in a heavy chop as now the nose of the boat is light and it won't bury under the waves as much as it used to.

Mast: Aluminum Keel Stepped Masts (Proctor E, Ex, or Cobra) are an asset and certainly better than wood deck stepped telephone poles. The mast in my boat is located as far forward as the rules permit (60 inches). These measurements are very important. My boat originally had the mast stepped at 63 inches and *this hurts*.

I am presently using a Procter E. Section. The rigging measurements are as follows (with jib hoisted):

- 1) Mast raked forward. From Mast tip to transom, 29 feet, 11 inches.
- Mast raked back. From Mast tip to transom, 28 feet 10 inches.
- Distance between spreader tips (when raked back) 18 inches.
- Mast well on deck, 8 inches long, 2³/₄ inches wide.

Mast Rakes: Very few boats come with factory installed forward and aft mast pullers and these gadgets are very important, mainly the aft mast puller for reaching. Better than explain how to install them in this article, next time you see a Chubasco Snipe copy their system.

By now you must have noticed that I have invented nothing, but merely applied to my boat what seemed to work best for the boats of some well-known skippers. This is the case of the center-board shape and the mast rigging. In other cases such as weight distribution I have used a little common sense.

The combination of changes have produced a boat that will bring you a Trophy every so often and will keep you competitive all the time.

Howie Richards also from Oakville finished 2nd., with Bent Poulsen of Oakville and John Storey of Shediac finishing 3rd and 4th respectively. Actually, the final finish was just the reverse order of the standing going into the last race. Steve Keary displayed his ability to sail well in light winds as well as in strong winds. This fact was a big factor in his success.

The amazing thing about the regatta was that the outcome was uncertain right up until 400 yds of the finishing line of the final race. There was only 2½ minutes of time remaining for the finalrace to be completed when Steve and Bill crossed the finishing line. Incidentally Steve again showed his ability to sail in light winds by finishing 5th at the Western Hemispheres in Bermuda in September.



GARY BOSWELL AND NORTH SAILS TOGETHER WIN THE WESTERN HEMISPHERES

Bob Cummings of Fleet 1 in Dallas is the winner of the Minneford Trophy for the second time but has a new trophy in the Reichner. He was beaten out by Emilio Salvi of Brazil in 1957 for the International High Point Championship. Always a man in contention, he was runner-up in 1968. This year he had 16 firsts and 5 seconds in a strong fleet to give him 1731.2 points.

Bob Rowland of Cowan Lake, another very fine sailor was runner-up with a score of 1727.6 points. Bud Booth of Onondaga, and governor of District V, was third with 39 races for a score of 1718.1. That many races gives a whole lot of exposure for foul outs but he had no worse than a 4th - should be somewhat of a record.

Another interesting observation was the tie for 6th place between John Rose of Seattle and Richard Wadlow of Lincoln. Considering the scoring system used for point scores it seems rather incredible. But each had 9 firsts and 1 second.

Pennie Davis of the Iowa-Nebraska Fleet sailed in a total of 49 races. Considering the short sailing season one has to be really busy to sail that many races.

Long-time Sniper, Eugene (Penny) Simmons from the Spanish Point, Bermuda Fleet was 8th with a score of 1688.5 the best of any sailor outside the United States.

For the past few years the number of point scores turned in has been in a downward trend. This year 684 scores were sent to the office. Considering the problems the class had last year this is commendable. Another indication of the competition in the class is the fact that there were only 5 scores over 1700 as compared to 6 last year and 12 the year before.

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

Cockpit Length:

It probably would have been better to relate the length of the fore deck to the bow rather than forward end of the centerboard slot – but it wasn't. However, if the aft end of the fore deck is not over $24\frac{1}{2}$ " ahead of the aft end of the daggerboard slot this accomplishes the intention of the Board of Governors and allows the use of either width daggerboard, with the board in the maximum aft position. With a pivot board, the aft limit in the foredeck is 1" max ahead of the front of the slot.

Centerboard Trunk:

The change in trunk height is permitted only on boats complying with paragraph 56. Lowering the trunk on an old boat will be difficult, since it may be difficult to add the necessary flotation to give compliance with paragraph 56. In any case – such a revision in an old boat would void the measurement certificate and require a re-check by a measurer before being sailed in a point score race or sanctioned regatta, just as a new boat must have a valid measurement certificate for these events. These rules are supposed to be enforced by the Fleet Captain. When the Fleet Captain himself modifies his own boat and doesn't get it re-checked, some other skipper will just have to protest him. The same rules should apply, from Fleet Captains to officers, all of whom should know better, but apparently some don't.

Ballast Installation:

The ballast situation perhaps needs a bit of clarification. Refer to Paragraph 54 in the 1970-71 Rule Book.

a. Any boat can carry 10 lbs. ballast attached to the deck.

b. An all glass boat (floorboards if any, deck etc.) can carry 20 lbs. under the deck.

c. A 381 lb. boat can carry an additional amount equal to 36 lbs. minus centerboard weight *anywhere* (does not need to be under the deck). (On a 410 lb. boat it is 65 lbs. minus centerboard, on a 400 lb. boat, 55 lbs.; 390 lb. boat, 45 lbs.).

d. If the centerboard weighs more than 36 lbs., all ballast must comply with a. & b. above.


e. 10 lbs. of any ballast may be easily removable.

In checking compliance with rule 56, the 300 lbs. represents the weight of skipper and crew. It shall be placed whereever the skipper and crew would be after righting the boat to facilitate sailing away. Bailers may be open or shut, whichever facilitates sailing away. The 300 lbs. shall be on the boat when checking water level on boats with lowered centerboard trunks. Placement same as in checking for compliance with Paragraph 56. Sufficient time shall be allowed when the boat is capsized to let it float as low as it ever will. After righting, sufficient time shall be allowed to reach equilibrium with water flowing out of the suction bailer if the boat is so designed, to flow out of the holes in the transom if this method is used, or out of the trunk if the boat has a self bailing cockpit with the floor high enough to drain this way. The equilibrium water level in the boat shall be 2" below the top of the trunk, unless the water drains through the trunk. Same requirement for pivot board trunks.

MEASUREMENT AT THE NATIONALS

The last sentence of paragraph 1 in the Restrictions and Measurements says "No discrepancies permitted on professionally built boats". This means for *any* kind of race (even fleet point score) for professionally built boats—and at the Nationals, no discrepancies of any kind are allowed on any boat.

Last year at Springfield, a new method of measuring and a new measuring rig was used. The local measuring committee and some others were not at that time convinced of the perfection of either the rig or the method, and some boats were allowed to race, which later checking showed should not have been allowed. This year there are no such doubts and no discrepancies whatever will be accepted—no matter how minor or where they may be.



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



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
