They were used in winning the 1969, '70 and '71 U.S. Nationals. In '71 they were 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th.


They were used by the winners of the last 2 Jr. Nationals, in '71 they were 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th.

They were used by the 1970 and '71 North American Champ (Cork).

They were 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th in the 1971 Midwinter Circuit (Nassau, Miami and Clearwater).

In 1972 we are introducing the Cobra Boom. It is very light and provides the stiffness required to keep the leech of the main tight on a reach. Bendy booms waste power.

Can you buy one set of sails to cover all racing conditions? Yes if it's an Elms. The new sails that we have been manufacturing the last part of 1971 have proved to be excellent all weather sails. Our 1971 No. 1 model seemed to get faster as the wind increased, so we went to work on it and tried to improve it's light air performance.

We were able to make them considerably faster in light air without hurting the medium and heavy air performance.

The proof comes from the World Championship in Brazil. The conditions were from 45 MPH down to a vacuum. Elms Sails consistently were the best, winning 5 of the seven races and getting 5 of the seven seconds. The over all performance for us was 1st, 3rd and 4th. The second boat used a combination of two sailmakers, main by one, jib by another.

This last year we also got our 5th straight U.S. National Championship. Together with a 4th showing, made our sails the most consistent there. This regatta was very light.

The Juniors had wind up to 20. Elms Sails got 1st, 2nd and 4th.

The Nassau Midwinters were heavy. Elms Sails got 7 straight firsts, capturing 1st and 2nd in the championship.

These sails were all 1971 No. 1's except for the 3 boats that did well in the Worlds. They had 1972 models. Their performance would warrant you buying the new all purpose Elms Sails in 1972.

We are calling them the 1972 No. 1.

PENNY SIMMONS SWEEPS BERMUDA RACE WEEK

Penny Simmons of Bermuda dominated Race Week, with a spectacular record of 4 firsts and a second in the 6-race series to win the 350th Anniversary Trophy. Fred Thurston of U.S.A. placed second while Sonny DeCosta of Bermuda followed with a close third.

Sailing in near perfect conditions most of the week (April 28-May 6) in winds that ranged from light to moderate, the 9 Bermuda and 13 U.S. boats experienced stiff competition. It was a close battle in almost every race, with the top ten positions frequently changing.


The First race was held under sunny skies in a 10-knot northerly. Dick Belvin of Bermuda reached the first mark with a significant lead, followed by Fred Thurston and Tom St. John (U.S.A.). Thurston and Sonny DeCosta (Bermuda) passed St. John on the second reach while Belvin kept his lead to the second leeward mark. At the end of the third leeward leg, Thurston caught Belvin in his windshadow, gained the advantage, and finally tacked on the inside of the mark, 1972 Race Week Champion, Wayne Soares of Bermuda, DeCosta, and St. John were overlapped around the mark. Thurston and Soares sailed bow to bow until Thurston forced Soares to tack for clear air. Thurston maintained first while DeCosta forged ahead of Soares, Penny Simmons of Bermuda, who had sailed mid-fleet, surged up from the ranks to finish 4th. St. John held 5th while Belvin finished 6th.

A 12-knot northerly and sunny skies dominated the Second race in which Penny Simmons got off to a good start and maintained a sizeable lead to nip between the early Solings for a 1st place. Sonny DeCosta held second place for the first two reaches until Thurston passed him mid-way up the second beat. Behind Thurston and DeCosta, the rest of the fleet kept a tight formation during the final weather leg. Bermudians Richard Todd, Wayne Soares and Dick Belvin jockeyed among the Solings near the finish, while Jim Fairclough (U.S.A.) came up to nip Belvin for 6th place.

Heavier weather blew in for the Third race with 18-knots and swelling seas. Simmons again led the way, completely outdistancing the fleet. Strung out yards behind him were Belvin, Herb West (U.S.A.), W. Soares, Todd, St. John, Jim Amos (Bermuda), and Conrad Soares (Bermuda). Although St. John came up on the last windward leg to challenge West for 3rd., West held his position and St. John followed close in his wake in 4th.

The wind, still up, shifted to the east for the Fourth race, St. John powered off the line and beat everyone to the first mark, followed closely by Simmons and Fitz Gram (U.S.A.). Simmons quickly took over on the first reach while Amos moved up to 2nd. Both Simmons and Amos Surged through the whitecaps, maintaining comfortable leads on the rest of the fleet. Yards behind, St. John and Belvin followed the two lead boats around the windward mark. Gram, who had fluctuated between 3rd and 5th, traded places with St. John on the run but fell back to 5th on the beat, while Belvin slipped past St. John for a 3rd and Thurston passed W. Soares for 6th.

The conditions moderated slightly for the Fifth race as the wind dropped to 12-15 knots and shifted to the north. Simmons led the fleet, occasionally splitting tacks with Thurston. Amos (Continued on page 6)

THE COMMODORE SAYS

"ONE BOAT FOR ALL"

That is the title of the SCIRA movie produced several years ago. It certainly proves true when you see the many young people, couples, brothers and sisters, young ladies, and older people, including an octogenarian at the Southern Championship, sailing Snipes. You don't have to be a superb gymnast to participate in the fun of sailing Snipes, but it does help to have strong stomach muscles when it's blowing 25 knots in California or Bermuda. Except for these extreme conditions, everyone can enjoy the pleasures of Snipe racing.

THE SCORE

This was definitely one of the better months as far as boat numbers are concerned. 156 were issued bringing the total to 486 for the year. Japan asked for 100 for the second time this year. The U.S. took 21, Denmark 20, Argentina 6, Portugal 4, Canada and Sweden 2 each and 1 went to the Bahamas. No new fleets were chartered.

THOUGHTS WHILE SAILING

Last year Flavio Caiuby conceived the idea that something needed to be done about simplifying the measurement rules. He is National Secretary of Brazil and had just finished translating the Measurement Data Sheet into Portuguese. The project of translation took in excess of 40 hours and certainly gave him incentive for his idea.

The pros and cons of changing rules were discussed at the Western Hemispheres. Everyone felt that constant change of rules is not good for the class and certainly is annoying to the members. However, when you consider that it is possible to have as many as 21 different size daggerboards you begin to wonder if we really have a one-design class.

The concensus was that any change should be in the direction of being more restrictive. There is no intention to reduce weight, change the basic lines of the boat or advance new concepts. Obviously, the application would only be to new boats built after the effective date.

Many of these problems have already been discussed at Board and Membership meetings so it is not new. Basically, the problem lies, as Ted Wells puts it, in the fact that we started off as a wooden, home-built class and the rules were designed as such. We now have a class that is primarily fiberglass and have tried to modify the rules to accommodate this fact. Although we have done a fine job, some improvements could be made.

Accordingly, Commodore Ralph Swanson has appointed a Rules Study Committee to undertake the project. The committee is to serve until such time as they complete their study. The results will then be submitted to the Rules Committee for approval and then will go to the Board. It is a massive undertaking but we hope it will be wound up in time for the next possible rule change date of January 1, 1976. It is also intended that full publicity be given to the proposals. We would definitely like to publish progress reports as they become available.

Flavio Caiuby will be chairman and the other members are Dan Williams in the U.S. and Nils Toftgaard-Hansen in Denmark. The size of the committee was purposely kept small so as not to be unweidly. You will also note that there are representatives from North & South, America and from Europe which should give various viewpoints. Dan is a member of the Board of Governors and has been sailing for some 25 years. Nils is Secretary for North Europe and is a boat builder. So you can see they are good sound Snipe-types.

If anyone has any comments or suggestions do not hesitate to write to them. They certainly want to know what the membership wants. If you want to be heard, do so now – not after their project is completed. One further suggestion: write them in such a manner that they do not have to answer your letters. We certainly do not want them spending their time corresponding and not get their job done. The addresses are as follows:



pressed Thurston on the first reach while Simmons widened his lead. Thurston and DeCosta sailed high on the second reach while Amos took the straight route and rounded the leeward mark second. Thurston and DeCosta battled on the second windward leg until DeCosta gained a small lead at the mark, rounding ahead of Amos and St. John. Thurston passed DeCosta on the run and then slipped back to 5th at the finish as St. John and Amos came up on a starboard lift to finish 3rd and 4th behind Simmons and DeCosta.

The wind swung over to the south and dropped to a shifty 8-10 knots under clear skies for the final race. To give the five skippers vying for 2nd place a chance to break ties, Simmons, who easily clenched 1st, did not sail the race. Belvin had the start at the favored leeward end but Thurston gained a sizeable lead at the first mark. He was followed by George Hock (U.S.A.), Gram, and DeCosta. DeCosta sailed high on the first reach. picking up Hock and Gram while Amos moved into 3rd on the second reach leaving Hock 4th and SCIRA Commodore Ralph Swanson 5th. Jim Fairclough (USA) moved up to 3rd and Carlos Bosch (Bermuda) moved to 6th. Thurston and DeCosta maintained their leads to the finish. Behind them, positions shifted frequently. Bosch finished 3rd, while Belvin, St. John and Fairclough crossed the finish line seconds apart.

The results left no doubt that Penny Simmons sailed his 19-yr old Danish-built Botyed with a charmed hand. Most of the time he was so far ahead of the rest of the Snipes, he could have competed against the earlier starting Solings. He was assisted by his talented crew Larry Lindo, third time 1st place crew winner of Race Week. While no skipper has ever won Race Week twice, Lindo as crew has managed multiple victories. The question in Snipe circles - is Lindo a prerequisite to winning Race Week - or does he just know how to pick a winner?

Thurston, in his fiberglass Chubasco and DeCosta, in his wooden Gerber,

successfully defended their '72 titles in a fleet that had nearly doubled in size since the previous year. Thurston again was the only American skipper in the winner's circle, and this year was the only skipper in Race Week to sail with a junior crew -13 yr. old Danny Coughlin.

On land, conditions were as perfect as on the sea. Bermudian hospitality again was superb. From the outstanding organization, which included the shipment of boats gratis from the U.S., and the accomodations arrangements, to the gracious finishing touches of welcome and friendship - the regatta was a tremendous success. Spectator boats were provided, parties were held at the yacht clubs and homes of fleet members in order to insure that no Race Week participant left Bermuda a stranger. Each detail, so smoothly worked out, represented months of planning as well as total involvement of fleet members. The event has become so popular, there is promise of even greater Snipe participation in the future.

Bill Coberly, Decatur, Illinois was second followed by Bob Cummings of Dallas, Texas. Bob was high point man in 1970 and came back from 8th place last year. Skip French, Bantam Lake, dropped from second to 4th and Bob Rowland, Cowan Lake went from 4th to 5th. Fred Thurston, Pete Duvoisin, Norm Tanner, Paul Festerson and Rex Tucker finished out the top ten.

A quick glance down the "boat column" shows a number spread in the top 10 of almost 11,000 – old boats do stay competitive. But look down as far as Harlen Wilkinson. If you think "714" couldn't be the right number, right you are. His Fleet Captain forgot to put the 19 in front of it.

Alberto Gainza and Jose Asad of Argentina were the first junior team in the regatta.



San Isidro, Buenos Aires, site of the next Western Hemisphere Championship, was host for the event in which 40 Snipes participated. Countries represented were Brazil with 3 Snipes, Uruguay with 2, and 35 from Argentina.

Two Brilliant Brazilians, both Paradedas, fought for top honors. First was Paulo Paradeda whose Olympic point total for the five races was 6 points, closely followed by Luis Paradeda with 8.7 in second place. In third place with 11.7 points was Horatio Pastori of Uruguay. Fourth and Fifth places went to Argentina with Fernando Sanjurjo 4th and Pedro Dates 5th.
