One will be sad to learn of the sudden death of Yves Le Bour. Aged 69, Yves died on January 28th and laid to rest at St. Laurent de Grez-sur-Loing.

Yves was dedicated to SCIRA. In earlier days, he held office as French National Secretary, building the class within his homeland after the ravages and trauma of World War II. His drive and enthusiasm to rekindle the SCIRA torch in the late 1940s and into the 50s was an example to Europe. Whilst in office, Yves undertook his duties with vigour and traveled extensively. He was both a competent and highly able helmsman.

These recent years, Yves became less mobile but continued to work for Snipe quietly in the shadows. As always under his command, the work he undertook reached a perfect conclusion. The entire Le Bour family have always supported the Class, therefore I feel confident that they will continue to build on what Yves has effectively bequeathed. SCIRA France.

Sailing the Internet Snipe Style!

Welcome to the 21st Century! You've seen them on television, heard them on the radio, read them in newspapers and probably heard it around the boat yard. What's this WWW stuff? If you've got access to a computer these days, you probably are already on-line. That is, hooked up to the Internet, the latest in worldwide communication. So, where can you go if you're on-line? The Snipe Bulletin's inside reporters sailed the Web for you to let you know what's hot and what's not!

For starters, the Snipe Class began with it's own web page, under the tutelage of Steve Keckler and Alex Pline. With their "webmastering," SCIRA set the pace for the rest of the world of one-design classes. Steve and Alex designed a page that incorporates just about everything you would want to know about Snipes; from a description of our boat to regatta schedules, results, photo gallery, sailing instructions, fleets in the US and worldwide, merchandise, blueprints to build your own boat, and a used boat listing. This kind of readily available information spawned several other regional pages that have also taken off. Gianmaria Bertanzon and Antonio Bari of Italy were mirroring what Steve and created an Italian version that now hosts our Snipe rules. The beauty of this really hits home when you are in another country and seriously need the SCIRA Scoring Program (when you left the disk at home ..) and realize that you can download the program where you are and run a Snipe regatta!

Of course, in addition to our regional Snipe pages, there are also the ISAF (International Sailing Federation), US Sailing, and numerous other sailing related pages. Those of particular interest to Snipe sailors would be the builders and sailmakers for our Class. North and Sobstad Sailmakers both have very good web pages, with separate departments specifically for Snipe tuning and even ordering new sails. Equipment manufacturers such as Harken and Seitech Marine Products also have their own pages. Many Snipe builders are now on-line, with more coming on-line each day. Here, you can check out photos of the latest in deck and hull design, as well as view current prices. Bring your calculator; since the web is international, many prices and measurements are given in



home currency and metric measurement.

Still confused? How about getting your feet wet with electronic mail (e-mail)? Steve and Alex also set up our own Snipe mailing list which currently has approximately 550 subscribers from all over the world. Subscription prices are free (except for your online time). It has become an open forum on Snipe topics and a chance for all Snipe sailors to talk to other sailors on the other side of the world. Some of the many topics discussed have been: bottom fairing, centerboard vibration, legality of hiking pants, skippers looking for crews, regatta promotion, etc. Many of the Board members of SCIRA are now using e-mail as their primary means of communication. No need to check what time it is in another part of the world - just send a e-mail and they can read it at their leisure. The nice thing about the Snipe mailing list is that it is commercial free. Everyone has been minding their p's and q's, and seldom is there a reprimand from the webmaster.

Another idea to come out of the web pages is regatta promotion. The 1997 Snipe World Championship committee has set up their own Snipe page and will post the Notice of Race, Sailing Instructions, schedule of events and housing and charter boat information. Linked to the page are city and tourist information including weather links! The Committee plans to post daily results and hopefully have a photo gallery of regatta pictures. Other plans include competitor interviews and possibly a "write-in" session, giving other sailors a chance to ask competitors questions during the regatta.

To send a message to the entire list, address your e-mail to: snipe@ai.mit.edu. This will automatically send your message to all the 550 (or so) subscribers.





Farragut Trophy - 40th Edition

November 1996

This Trophy was first raced in 1957, and has been celebrated year after year until now, and today is oneb of the most antiques in Spain. This year, in addition, it was specially competitive because it is one of the three qualification regattas for the San Diego Worlds.

The first day, Fernando Rita was heading the classification, after two races sailed under very light wind conditions. It was surprising that the first six places were for Menorcan crews, who beat other boats that had come from the mainland in order to get qualification points for the San Diego Worlds.

After the second day proves, David Saura was in the first place, because Fernando entered in the 7th place in the second race. Damian Borras, after winning the third, was third in the general classification, after Fernando Rita. Also, Cristobal Bosch was having an excellent participation, located in the 4th. place, after Damian.

Finally, the Trophy was won by David Saura, followed by Fernando Rita and Cristobal Bosch, who finally beat Damian because of his bad actuation in the last day.

It is remarkable the very slight wind, and the constant shifts in the Regatta field, which provided a lot of difficulty for the Committee.

At the end, a very friendly prizegiving, assisting the 45 participating crews, closed the event, and hope that this year we can celebrate the 41st. edition.

Preview of the 1998 World Masters

Cordoba, Argentina

One of the (few) great pleasures of growing old is participating in the Snipe World Masters regattas. I have been fortunate enough to have competed, albeit without distinction, in most of them since the first one was held in Atlanta in 1986. I look forward to these events like a child looks forward to Christmas. I can hardly wait for the next one, which will be near Cordoba, Argentina, in March 1998. Francisco "Pancho" Agusti, the 1998 World Masters Regatta Chairman and current National Secretary for Argentina, anticipates about 80 competitive teams, including about 50 from South America and 30 from North American, Europe and Japan.

I have just now returned from a trip to South America in which I spent a wonderful day at the site of the 1998 Snipe World Masters near Cordoba, Argentina. I made the 90 minute flight northwest from Buenos Aires across the rich, agricultural "Pampas" to Cordoba early February 12 and was met at the Cordoba airport by Pancho who I had gotten to know at the Masters in Japan (1994) and in Norway (1996). After a brief driving tour of Cordoba, the second largest city in Argentina, we drove 45 minutes to the beautiful Lago San Roque, a large lake surrounded by rolling hills, near the resort town of Villa Carlos Paz. What a setting for a regatta! The population of Carlos Paz swells during the Argentine summer (December-March) from 40,000 to over 300,000, and there is every imaginable resort amenity. The Yacht Club has a large, comfortable club house, and there is ample boat parking near the launching ramp. Pancho says there will be 30 new Snipes produced in Chile for charter to non-South Americans during the Masters (and available for purchase following the Masters). The weather in March (the equivalent of August in the northern hemisphere) will be ideal, with daytime temperatures in the low 80's F. And the food...the beef in Argentina is fantastic, buttery tender and flavorful with less fat marbling than typically found in the United States. I found the Argentine hospitality to be warm, generous, and in the best spirit of Snipes sailing around the world.

The South American Championships are being hosted by Pancho and the Snipe Fleet of Lago San Roque in March 1997, and about 90 teams are expected. This will provide a rehearsal for the Masters. I had such a great day with Pancho I wanted to stay for the South American Champs. Alas, I'll have to wait another year, but I sure look forward to the Masters in March of 1998.






