

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

WELLS' WANDERINGS

PLYWOOD HULLS

Last month the Board of Governors gave me the job of working out the rules and regulations for the use of plywood in Snipe hulls. I have written and talked to many boat builders, plywood suppliers, and Snipe skippers. As you might expect, there were about as many different opinions as there were people. It is also to be expected that the first set of rules and regulations will probably not be perfect and will have to be modified with experience. However, anyone proceeding with these rules may do so without fearing that any change will obsolete their boats. No change of that nature will be made.

The basic requirements that must be met are as follows:

1. There must be no possible racing advantage due to the use of plywood in the construction of the hull.


The hull made out of plywood must not be inferior to a planked hull in respect to safety and sturdiness.

3. Since the main purpose of allowing plywood was to permit standard Snipes to be built cheaper by the high production professional builders, it is obviously necessary to consider their manufacturing methods; however, at the same time the rules must provide a means by which a home builder can build an equivalent hull.


The rules which will permit meeting these requirements are as follows:

In order to insure that a plywood hull will have no conceivable racing advantage, materials will be specified which will automatically make a plywood hull weigh slightly more than a hull made of the best grades of western red cedar and about the same as a hull made of juniper.

This material will also provide a hull which has strength and sturdiness equivalent to the present Snipe hull. The bottom must be the equivalent of 1/2-inch fir plywood. This will probably be accomplished by the home builder using

two thicknesses of 1/4-inch plywood. The high production professional builder will probably purchase 1/2-inch plywood with special cross-banding to permit easier bending. This plywood will probably be available later on for home builders if they wish to purchase it. Outer plys of mahogany may be used if desired, but the weight of the plywood used must be at least one pound nine ounces per square foot. The sides must be made of 3/8-inch fir plywood or equivalent, weighing one pound 2-1/2 ounces per square foot.

By the use of plywood a lot of flotation will be lost. This must be made up to provide a safe hull and the only safe way to provide this additional flotation is through the use of Styrafoam. This material is now used by practically all boat builders for providing flotation. It can also be purchased in most towns from window display companies (it is that white stuff that they make fancy Christmas decorations out of). Three cubic feet of this material must be used, secured under the deck. It comes in standard sizes, 12 by 4 by 36 inches, and three of these chunks will do the job.

The clamp will be moved to the sheer in order to provide a satisfactory means of attaching the deck. In order to simplify the construction of the keel and provide adequate fastening surface, the keel itself will be reduced in thickness to 1/2 inch instead of 3/4 inch, but the keel batten shall be increased to 1 inch by 7 inches. Also, to provide adequate fastening surface at the chine, the chine pieces shall be doubled, to be the equivalent of 1-1/2 by 1-1/2 inches. The top of the chine pieces may be beveled to be parallel to the bottom if desired. All frames, deck beams, transom, etc., remain as at present.


It should be emphasized that while ordinary exterior plywood is structurally satisfactory it will be very difficult to put on a perfect finish, and it may be questionable as to how long it will stand up on a boat that is in the water all of the time. A material such as Firzite made by U. S. Plywood should certainly be used on any fir plywood, and it will probably be necessary to cover the sides and the bottom either with fabric doped on or with fiberglas cloth in order to secure the best racing finish. Of course, if plywood with a mahogany face ply is used, this will not be necessary.

In addition to the ordinary exterior grade, fir plywood is also available as boat quality and also marine quality. The boat quality is similar to exterior quality but there are no voids in the core and both faces are of good quality fir. The marine quality is the same as boat quality but with a better glue. Both of these can be secured in pieces 16 feet long.

Those builders who have built more or less custom Snipes in the past will probably continue to use planking as they use a small number of highly skilled workmen and their time saving will not be so great. Also, unless mahogany face plys are used, it will be difficult to get the perfection of finish that is expected of these builders.


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


