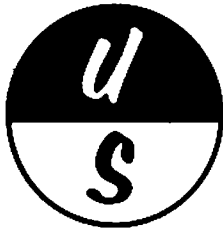

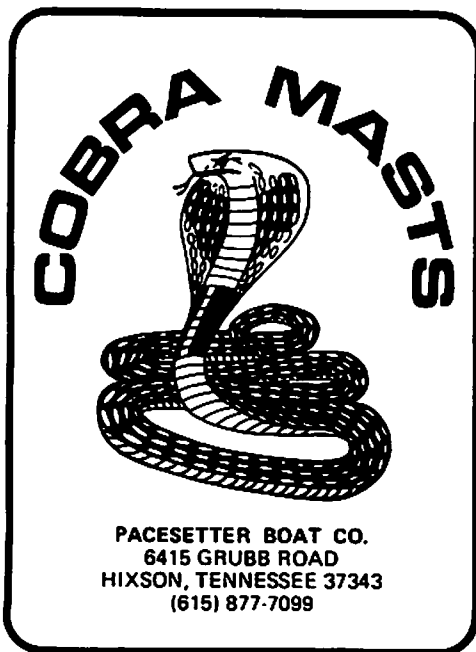

For those of you with a taste for a more conventional meal, there is Cattle-men's and a host of other excellent restaurants. The Fort Worth Boat Club's excellent dining room will be open for breakfast, lunch, and dinner throughout the Nationals. Just up the road from the club is one of the area's better catfish restaurants, which also serves a fine breakfast. An assortment of Pizza Hut, Sonic Drive-in, and a country steak house can be found in nearby Saginaw, or on the Jacksboro Highway near 820.

The Kimball Museum offers an outstanding collection, while the Amon Carter Museum has the largest collection of Remington and Charlie Russell Western art. If Western art and sailing are too dull, then the double loop (yes, upside-down twice) Shockwave roller coaster at Six Flags Over Texas, should be just your speed. Any way you want it, the Fort Worth Boat Club is going all out to make your visit to Texas enjoyable and memorable.

While the nearest hotels and motels are ten, or more, miles from the Club, there is an adequate supply from the economical to the luxurious. A listing with a map of the Fort Worth Area are included in this issue. The "Boat Club" is making arrangements for a sizable camping area several miles up the road, near the school grounds. If you plan to camp in a tent, or live in your luxurious travelling home, please contact: Bob Morgan, Manager of the FWBC, to reserve a space and get the detailed location.

Davis Is Top Skipper At Missouri Valley

The Iowa-Nebraska Sailing Assoc. hosted 36 boats for the annual Missouri Valley Championship Regatta July 3, 4, & 5, while celebrating the 30th anniversary of the Iowa-Nebraska fleet and the 100th anniversary of their home water, Lake Manawa. Henry Davis, of Omaha, succeeded in returning the Robert Harding Memorial Trophy to the home fleet.

The regatta opened Friday morning with a junior race, held in light air and light rain. It was won by Mark Stearley of the Lincoln Sailing Club, followed by John Briggs, also of Lincoln, with Mike Toohey of INSA in third place.

Two races were scheduled for Friday afternoon, but due to the light air, only one was sailed. It was won by Henry Davis and crew Jeff Toohey, from Omaha. Doug Day, from Lake Lotawana, and his crew Scott Ruff, were second, followed by Doug and Rita Goppert, also of Lake Lotawana. Mike Toohey won the first "B" fleet race.

Three races were among the many activities scheduled for Saturday the fourth. Both of the morning races were won by Terry and George Croasdale, of Lake Weatherby, followed on both occasions by Henry Davis. Doug Goppert finished third in the first contest, and Doug Day finished third in the second. Tom Hood, of Omaha, won the first "B" fleet race.

A break in the racing schedule was made to provide for a waterskiing exhibition, aerobic show, and other Lake Manawa Centennial festivities. Medium winds prevailed again for the third Saturday race which was won by Henry Davis, followed by Doug Goppert and SCIRA Commodore Paul Festersen. Tom Hood won the "B" fleet. A Fourth of July picnic was held at the home of past SCIRA Commodore Floyd Hughes, where guests enjoyed fried chicken, live music, and a spectacular fireworks display.

The racing activity closed on Sunday morning, with one race sailed in light to medium air. Henry Davis clinched the title comfortably with another win. Doug Goppert finished second, and Bob Ewoldt and crew Kurt Christensen of Lincoln were third. Joe and John Spearing, of INSA, won the final "B" fleet race. Tom Hood and Phil Eberhart, both of Omaha, tied for the overall "B" fleet title on points, with Hood gaining the edge by beating Eberhart in three of the five races sailed.

Only one protest was filed in the ten races sailed by the two fleets. "R.C."

Mark Reynolds Earns Winter Circuit Honors

Chapin wins Midwinters in Clearwater to foil total Reynolds rout

MIDWINTER CHAMPIONSHIP— CLEARWATER:

The traditional Saturday practice race was replaced this year by the Frank Levinson/Phil Blair Memorial Race, won by Mark Reynolds. Phil and Frank, for many years part of the hard working team which has made the Midwinters the top-notch regatta that it is, both passed away last year. Two special trophies in their honor were awarded in addition to the regular top finishers prizes. The Phil Blair Trophy was awarded to the highest finisher over 50 years of age, Gonzalo Diaz. The second special trophy, in memory of Frank Levinson, was awarded to the skipper voted by his fellow sailors as demonstrating the best sportsmanship. This award went to a most deserving, well known, hard working and highly respected local sailor, Francis Seavy.

If there had been any doubts in anyone's mind about Francis, they were removed following the second race on Monday. Francis had just completely refinished Honey, his classic wood Mills boat. It looked like a piece of furniture just off

the showroom floor. During the maneuvering for the start of the second race, a head-on collision put a hole in the boat that you could put your arm through. Francis bit his tongue, cried a little, quietly withdrew and sailed for home. When asked about it he said, "I was on port. When I zigged, he zagged. When I zagged, he zagged. That's all there was to it." I think we all cried a little with Francis at the sight of the damage.

BACK TO THE RACES: A front came through Sunday with winds 35+. The committee had no problem deciding to cancel for the day. Monday we sailed three races in the Bay in 10-15 knot winds. Tuesday we had three races back-to-back in the Gulf. Winds were 8-10 in the first two of these races, and 15 to 18 in the final race.

Dave Chapin, with crew Mark Salih, was top dog with two firsts, two seconds, and a third. Consistency paid off. Competition was extremely tough as evidenced by the fact that of the six races, there were five different first place finishers. The second and third place boats,

Jeff Lenhart and Ed Adams had tie scores of 33.4 points, while fourth place winner Mark Reynolds had 34 points. Mark had crossed the line first in the third race only to learn that he had been over early at the start. This was his throwout race.

Steve and Connie Suddath with crew weight of about 265 lbs., and the first of non-professionals, did an outstanding job in the relatively heavy winds and chop. Their finishes were 2-3-4-5-8 for fifth place. Jerry Thompson was high in praise for his crew Karen Gregory who helped him to a sixth place finish over-all. Craig Martin, who recently filled the job at North Sails vacated by Mark Reynolds, finished seventh.

There were lots of top notch sailors in the top 20, and it wasn't uncommon to find sailors capable of high finishes in one or two races, but unable to maintain the consistency needed to stay on top. One such was Terry McLaughlin, new to the Snipe. An outstanding Canadian sailor, he has been selected to skipper Canada's entry in the next Americas Cup. He finished 3rd in the Memorial race and had a

In addition to the usual prizes and special memorial awards, a seemingly endless number of practical gifts all made and donated by Joann Levinson's shop were presented to over 20 top skippers. Another comment: It was a pleasure to see Ailene Blair actively working for the regatta. She was constantly in attendance and always working, whether at registration, cutting grapefruit for the cocktails, or whatever.
