AWARDED TO

The trophy shall be awarded to the first European skipper and crew.

ENTRY & ELIGIBILITY

Both skipper and crew shall be citizens or residents for at least one year of the country they represent, and each must present credentials signed by the National Secretary from the country he/she represents attesting that he/she is the entrant.

OPEN TO

Any SCIRA junior member that meets the requirements of eligibility for the year of the Championship.

REGATTA CONDITIONS

1. Held on alternate years with Junior World Championships of SCIRA at the venue selected by the European National Secretaries.
2. Eighth (8) or nine (9) races shall be scheduled.
3. The Notice of Race shall include the following:
 - (a) The Rules of Conduct for National and International Championships will apply.
 - (b) The Deed of Gift for the Junior Championship of Europe will apply.
 - (c) The maximum wind speed allowed for a start shall be 16 knots. A race shall be abandoned if, after the start, the wind increases to 19 knots or more.
 - (d) When less than seven (7) races are scored, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When seven (7) or more races are scored, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst eligible score.
4. There must be a separate Race Committee and Protest Committee.
5. A minimum of one team (skipper and crew) from each country shall be offered lodging and food.
6. No entry fee is requested.
7. The Organizing Authority must provide an adequate number of equally matched boats with good racing capability to loan or charter to competitors who do not bring their own boats.

Language:

The official language shall be English. The use of other languages, as secondary, can be the prerogative of the Organizing Authority and shall not be used for Official Communications with competitors from the Committees or Organizing Authority.

Trophy Responsibility:

The trophy is the responsibility of the winning skipper and his/her National Secretary. The National Secretary shall oversee that the trophy is taken care of, guarded and returned to the place designated for the next competition, properly boxed for shipment with all duties and other charges paid by the Fleet. The name of the winning skipper, crew, year, fleet and country shall be engraved at the winner's expense in uniform engraving.

Revision of Deed of Gift:

By agreement between the donor and the European National Secretaries.
