The trophy shall be awarded to the winning skipper.

OPEN TO

Any SCIRA member for the year of the regatta.

REGATTA CONDITIONS

1. Held on alternate years with the European Championship in waters selected by European National Secretaries.
2. A minimum of 7 and a maximum of 9 races shall be scheduled depending on local conditions.
3. The Notice of Race shall include the following:
 - (a) The Rules of Conduct for National and International Championships will apply.
 - (b) The Deed of Gift for the John Broughton European Snipe Cup will apply
 - (c) When less than five (5) races are scored, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When five (5) to seven (7) races are scored, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst eligible score. When more than seven (7) races are scored, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two (2) worst eligible scores.

LANGUAGE

The official language shall be English. The use of other languages, as secondary, can be the prerogative of the Organizing Authority and shall not be used for Official Communications with competitors from the Committees or Organizing Authority.

TROPHY RESPONSIBILITY

The trophy is the responsibility of the winning skipper. The skipper shall see that the trophy is taken care of, guarded and returned to the place designated for the next competition, properly boxed for shipment with all duties and other charges paid. The name of the winning skipper, crew, year, fleet and country shall be engraved at the winner's expense in uniform engraving.
